Course Description, Prerequisite, Corequisite:

ART-206- FIGURE DRAWING 3 credits (formerly ARTS-145)

This studio course is an introduction to the materials, processes, and aesthetic considerations in observational drawings of the human figure. Students will create a series of figure drawings that emphasize technical development, principles of pictorial composition and visual representation of the human form. Basic drawing helpful, but not a prerequisite. Five in class hours weekly. Prerequisite(s): None. Corequisite(s): ART-206L Mass Transfer Block: Credits earned in this course are counted towards the MassTransfer Block Humanities and Fine Arts requirements.

Course Objectives

By the end of ART-206, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate a basic understanding of,
 - A. Materials and Mediums (graphite, charcoal, paper, etc.) used in figure drawing.
 - B. Technical Processes (gesture, sighting, measuring human proportions, etc.) used in figure drawing.
 - C. Aesthetic Elements (proportion, form, value, visual weight, etc.) used in figure drawing.
- 2. Use a basic understanding of anatomy, including skeletal and muscular systems to complete accurate figure drawings from observation.
- 3. Apply safe and effective use of studio space and materials.
- 4. Exemplify an advanced standard of craftsmanship and work ethic.
- 5. Participate in the creative process of *imagining*, *designing*, *creating*, *and sharing* drawings.
- 6. Critique and explain the visual elements they see in their drawings and those of their peers.
- 7. Appreciate and critically compare figure drawings throughout history and in contemporary art as they pertain to class assignments.
- 8. Submit a portfolio of drawings in an organized and professional manner.
