## **Course Description, Prerequisite, Corequisite:**

ART-130: PAINTING 1 3 credits (formerly ARTS-142)

This studio course is an introduction to the materials, processes, and aesthetic considerations in oil painting. Students will create a series of paintings that will emphasize individual expression, technical development, principles of pictorial composition and visual representation. No previous art background is required. Five in- class hours weekly.Prerequisite(s): None. Corequisite(s): ART-130L. Mass Transfer Block: Credits earned in this course are counted towards the MassTransfer Block Humanities and Fine Arts requirements.

## **Course Objectives**

# By the end of ART-130, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate a basic understanding of,
  - A. Materials and Mediums (oil paint, mediums, brushes, supports) used in oil painting.
  - B. Technical Processes (lift out, glazing, alla prima) used in oil painting.
  - C. Aesthetic Elements (color theory, compositional concepts, depth, value) as used in oil painting.
- 2. Apply safe and effective use of studio space and materials.
- 3. Exemplify a basic level of craftsmanship achieved by a strong work ethic (patience, determination, and diligence) necessary to create.
- 4. Participate in the creative process of *imagining*, *designing*, *creating*, *and sharing* artwork.
- 5. Critique and explain the visual elements they see in their paintings and those of their peers.
- 6. Appreciate and critically compare painting techniques throughout history and in contemporary art as they pertain to class assignments.
- 7. Submit a portfolio of paintings in an organized manner.
