STUDENTS WILL LEARN ABOUT THE HISTORY OF COMMUNITY HEALTH WORK, THE CONTEXT IN WHICH HEALTH DISPARITIES EXIST, AND ABOUT THE ROLE OF THE COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER IN BRIDGING THESE DISPARITIES TO INCREASE ACCESS TO QUALITY CARE IN MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES. STUDENTS WILL ALSO LEARN ABOUT BASIC SKILLS REQUIRED OF A COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER.
