Competencies

- 1. Students will be able to distinguish between real and personal property and the differences in transferring title and ownership.
- 2. Students will be able to explain the various means by which a contract may be enforced, terminated, assigned or replaced.
- 3. Students will be able to describe the various aspects of housing affordability, including mortgage terms and tax considerations.
- 4. Students will be made aware of the various federal laws which protect Americans from unfair housing practices.
- 5. Students will be introduced major degree study programs and professions that help train students for a career in a variety of real estate fields.
- 6. Students will enhance critical thinking, decision making and problem solving skills.

- 1. Students will discuss the concepts of land ownership rights in real property.
- 2. Students will be able to describe and explain the basic economic and physical characteristics of real property.
- 1. Students will describe the primary written agreements and forms used in real estate sales and leasing.
- 2. Students will be able to describe the essential elements of contracts.
- 1. Students will be able to describe the terms, conditions and use of the promissory note.
- 2. Students will be able to describe the various types of real estate financing.
- 1. Students will discuss blockbusting, steering, redlining and other abusive housing practices.
- 2. Students will discuss the importance of real estate professionals understanding and complying with fair housing law.
- 1. Students will have discussions with guest speakers from other educational/degree granting institutions.
- 2. Students will meet and discuss opportunities for future employment with local business leaders.
- 1. Students will conduct scholarly research using a variety of sources.
- 2. Students will synthesize their research with written and oral presentations.
